# **Are Your Birth Classes Mother-Friendly?**

Following is a list of questions based on the user-friendly version of the Mother-Friendly Childbirth Initiative, *Having A Baby? Ten Questions To Ask.* 

#### 1. Who can be with me during labor and birth? Do you-

—invite the mother to decide whom she wants to have with her during the birth, including fathers, partners, children, other family members, or friends?	V/N
-inform your classes of the availability of midwives?	
—inform your clients of the availability of doulas?	
-provide referral sources for midwives and doulas?
